A meeting of this new film club, at the studio, 44, Valley-road, Shortlands, on Monday, opened with the showing of a 9.5 mm. film.

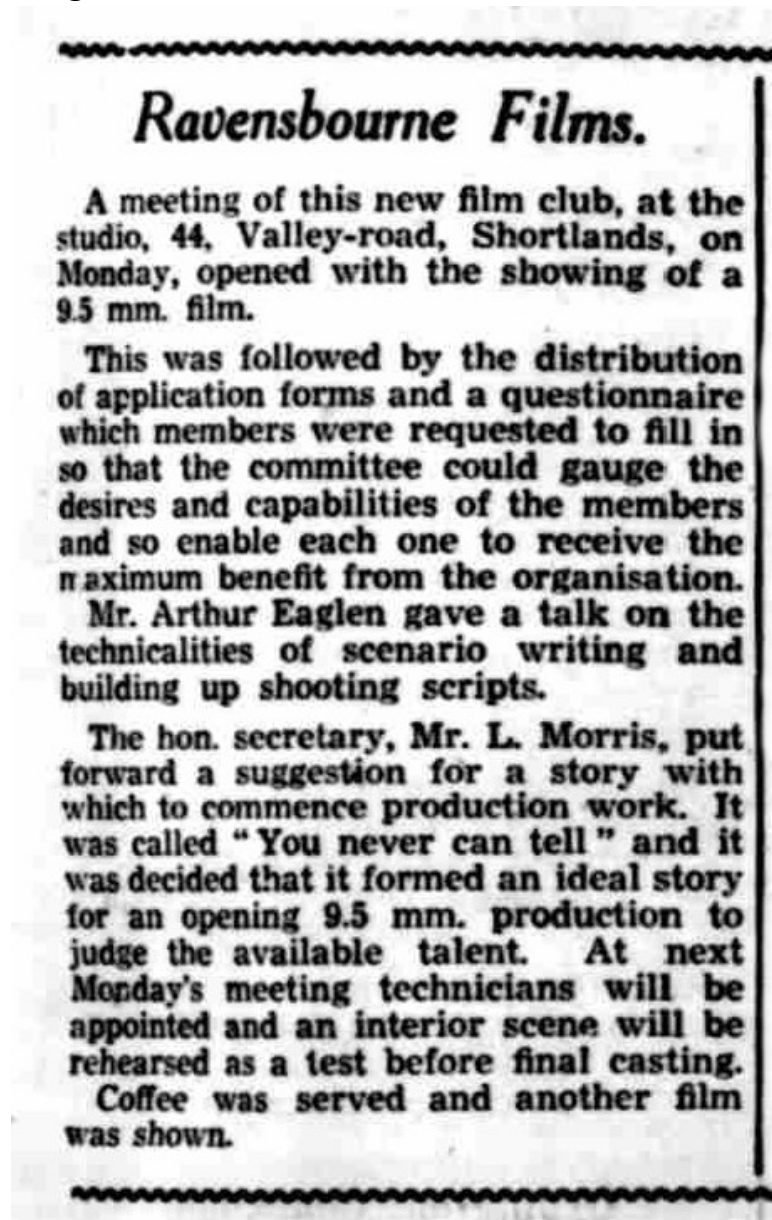
This was followed by the distribution of application forms and a questionnaire which members were requested to fill in so that the committee could gauge the desires and capabilities of the members and so enable each one to receive the maximum benefit from the organisation.

Mr. Arthur Eaglen gave a talk on the technicalities of scenario writing and building up shooting scripts.

The hon. secretary, Mr. L. Morris, put forward a suggestion for a story with which to commence production work. It was called "You never can tell" and it was decided that it formed an ideal story for an opening 9.5 mm. production to judge the available talent. At next Monday's meeting technicians will be appointed and an interior scene will be rehearsed as a test before final casting.

Coffee was served and another film was shown.

The director said that she was calling an audition of members of the acting group to cast the production, and that shooting would commence in a fortnight's time.

The secretary said that in the near future amongst other lectures would be one by the makers of a certain brand of colour film, and that a demonstration would be given by one of the make-up artists of Max Factor, Hollywood and London, Ltd.

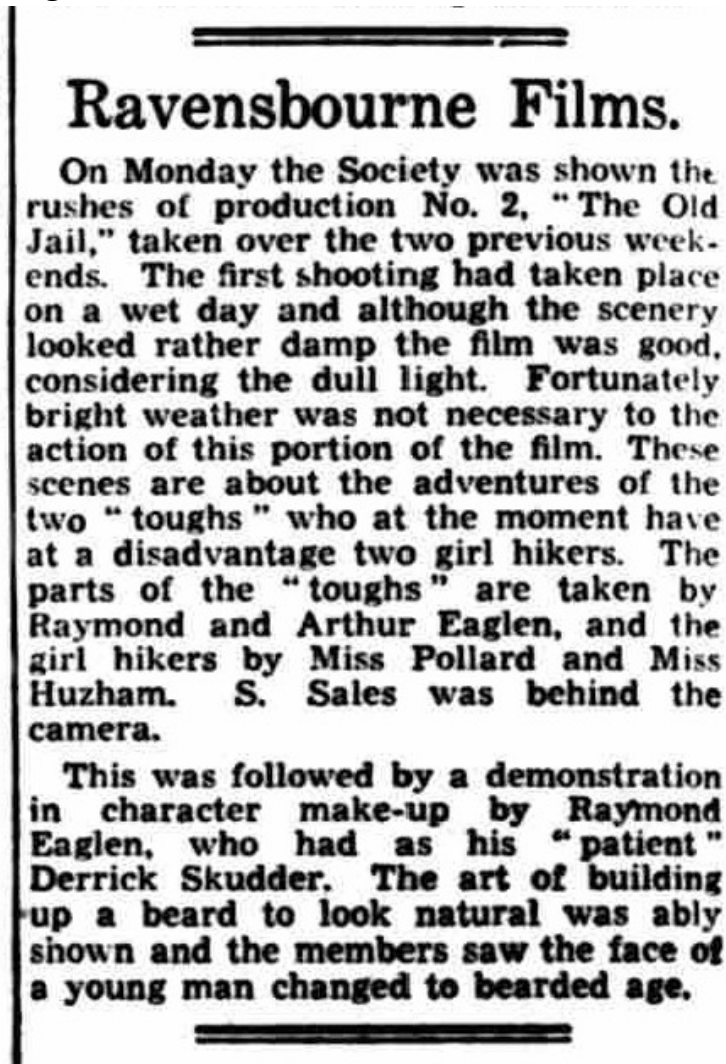

The first shooting had taken place on a wet day and although the scenery looked rather damp the film was good, considering the dull light. Fortunately bright weather was not necessary to the action of this portion of the film. These scenes are about the adventures of the two “toughs” who at the moment have at a disadvantage two girl hikers. The parts of the “toughs” are taken by Raymond and Arthur Eaglen, and the girl hikers by Miss Pollard and Miss Huzham. S. Sales was behind the camera.

This was followed by a demonstration in character make-up by Raymond Eaglen, who had as his “patient” Derrick Skudder. The art of building up a beard to look natural was ably shown and the members saw the face of a young man changed to bearded age.

CWMTILLERY CYCLIST BREAKS WELSH RECORD

376 Miles In 24 Hours

Mr. C. Kenward, of Cwmtillery, and Mr. A. C. Eaglen, who are members of the Cwmcarn Paragon Road Club, made attempts to beat the Welsh 24-hour record, which stood at 328 miles.

Both were successful. Eaglen covered 346 miles up to 4 p.m. on Sunday, to be beaten two hours later by Kenward with a great ride of 375 miles.

Most of the club members were placed at points as far apart as Cardiff, Pontypool, Abergavenny, Caerwent, Pontrilas, Brecon, Llandovery, Bridgend, Neath and Pontneathraughan, to hand food and drink to the record breakers at all hours of the day and night.

Kenward gained on Eaglen from the start, and at Pontneathvaughan was only 30 minutes behind him on the road. This was 244 miles.

At this point Eaglen was in some difficulty, having had two punctures during the night, but he made a marvellous recovery to keep the 30 minutes lead almost to the end.

Kenward finished very strongly, averaging 25 miles per hour over the last half-hour of his ride, and he paid tribute to Mr. C. Edwards, of East Side, Cwmtillery, who acted as his masseur.

The ride was cheered throughout by the Welsh Road Records Association, and the time by Mr. C. Smith, official timekeeper.
