

~ before or on 1908

Lilian Higby started living with her grandparents, William and Sarah Higby in Canewdon, Essex before or on 1908. Her father and step-mother and their son remained in Hong Kong.

The Higby family been living in this place for about 100 years by the time of Mrs. Lilian (Higby) Garner's death in 1982. Her grandparents, William and Sarah Higby lived in it for a long time before.

~ 1908

Mrs. Higby and Miss Lillian Higby were some of the ladies involved in decorating the church for a festival event.

From the newspaper, Southend Standard and Essex Weekly Advertiser, Thursday 22 October 1908:

CANEWDON.

THE CHURCH RESTORATION. --- The annual harvest thanksgiving services were held in the Parish Church on Sunday. For some weeks past another stage of the restoration of this beautiful and historic building has been in progress. The inner ceiling to the roof of the nave has been removed revealing a mass of beautiful timber, bearing indisputable signs of being as old as the tower itself. i.e., dating from 1464. The removal of this ceiling brought to light several defects in the roof. All the tiles were removed, and the roof has been put into a thoroughly safe and water tight condition. All this has been efficiently done by Messrs. Kemp and Allen, of Rochford, under the watchful eye of the Vicar (Rev. C. R. W. Hardy). For the festival, the sacred edifice had been beautifully decorated by Mrs. Hardy, who undertook the altar and communion rails; Mrs. Reeve, the choir stalls; the Misses Guiver, the pulpit; Mrs. Higby and Miss Lillian Higby, the font, lectern, pillars and window recesses. There were large congregations. The Vicar prefaced his sermon in the morning by alluding to the lateness of the festival, owing to the work of restoration. But it gave them the opportunity of meeting on what they might say was the birthday of the parish of Canewdon. On that day 892 years ago, between the spot where they were worshipping, and a radius of two or three miles, was fought what was known as the battle of Ashingdon, in which the able, but heathen Canute defeated Edmund Ironsides and became King of England. From this monarch the parish took its name.

~ 1908

In the year 1908, the first automobile arrived in Canewdon, Essex.

A news reporter from London came to visit "Frederick" Pickingale. The news of him being over 100 years old reached London.

The automobile drew the attention of many of the people of Canewdon including 17 year old Lilian Higby.


From the book, Modern Wicca: a History from Gerald Gardner to the Present, by Michael Howard, 2010:

Pages 57 and 58

"In October 1977, a few days before Hallowe'en, I decided to visit Canewdon in the hope of finding out more about Pickingill"

"Lillian Garner was eighty-seven years old when I met her, but her mind was, as they say, "as bright as a button." She invited me in for tea, and told me that she remembered George Pickingill from her childhood as a village character and eccentric old gentleman. She recollected when the first car came to the village that he had his photograph taken beside it."





The above two pictures of George Pickingale were taken that day by the reporter.

The top one was the one that Lilian Garner had in her possession for many years. Eric Maple had taken a picture of it when he visited Lilian Garner in 1959-1960. She gave it to Mike Howard in 1977.

Seeing how many times the Pickingill and Higby families could have meet (see Part II on the Higby ancestors), I think George Pickingill probably gave it to Lilian's grandparents, William and Sarah Higby because they were friends and more. I would assume that the reporter had more than one copy made for George Pickingale.

The second picture was in the newspaper Lloyd's Weekly Newspaper, Sunday 13 September 1908.





Eric Maple came into Canewdon in the winter of 1959 to 1960, while he was taking a vacation to recover from some illness.

From the book, Modern Wicca: a History from Gerald Gardner to the Present - By Michael Howard, 2010:

Page 47 - in the chapter of "The Pickingill Connection"

"Eric Maple had first visited the Essex witch village of Canewdon in 1959 while staying in the area to recover from an illness. Having an interest in the local folklore he heard tales from the older villagers about the witches who lived there fifty or sixty years before."

"When Eric Maple investigated the folk traditions of Canewdon in the winter of 1959-1960 he found stories about the witches living in and around the village in the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries had survived among the local farming community."

Ron Hutton read Eric Maple's work and felt that he needed to go to Canewdon and investigate.

From the book, "Triumph of the Moon: A History of Modern Pagan Witchcraft" by Ronald Hutton:


Page 297 in the Chapter of "Old Craft, New Craft"

"..... Such Data certainly existed in the 1960s, when people still survived who had lived in Canewdon at the opening of the century and known Pickingill. One was 'Granny' Lillian Garner, who had been one of Maple's chief informants. Another was Jack Taylor, then in a retirement home at Rayleigh. In April 1967 I spent some time in the district myself, inspired by Maple's book to collect further information. What I found exactly supported his original body of material, which is hardly surprising as it was gained from the same sources It confirmed the impression given by Maple, that Pickingill's clients, though numerous, were drawn mainly from rural south-east Essex. My only significantly new quantity of testimony was provided by Jack Taylor, whom Maple seems to have missed, and it was wholly in harmony with the latter's other evidence."

"20..... Mike Howard, talking to Lillian Garner in October 1977, heard a slightly different account of Pickingill from her, notably the detail that he had visitors 'from all over, including abroad', which accords better with Bill Liddell's portrait..."

A decade after Ron Hutton went there, Mike Howard went to Canewdon to find out more about George Pickingill.

From the book, "Modern Wicca: A History from Gerald Gardner to the Present" By Michael Howard, 2010:

Page 57 and 58 in the chapter of "The Pickingill Connection"

"In October 1977, a few days before Hallowe'en, I decided to visit Canewdon in the hope of finding out more about Pickingill...... I called at the vicarage and asked the aged minister if he could help me in my quest.... he kindly suggested that an elderly lady called Granny Garner might be able to help me, and he directed me to her cottage in the lane leading up to the church. Apparently she had been Eric Maple's chief informant in the village and he had described her as the last white witch in Canewdon.

Lillian Garner was eighty-seven years old when I met her, but her mind was, as they say, "as bright as a button." She invited me in for tea, and told me that she remembered George Pickingill from her childhood as a village character and eccentric old gentleman. She recollected when the first car came to the village that he had his photograph taken beside it. She revealed that her own mother had told her that Mr. Pickingill was the leader of a local coven of witches. Apparently her mother was actually a member of the coven and said that the witch master had "many visitors" from outside the village who came seeking his occult knowledge. Before I left, Lillian gave me the original of the photograph of George Pickingill that was published in Eric Maple's book *Dark World of the Witches*. A photograph of Granny Garner herself standing at the door of her cottage was reproduced with Maple's article on the Canewdon witches published in the encyclopedic work *Man, Myth and Magic* in the 1970s."

From a website "Old George Pickingill and the History of Modern Witchcraft", website constructed for Bill Liddell:

"Mike Howard visited Canewdon in 1977 and met 'Granny' Garner. Lillian Garner was Eric Maple's chief informant when he visited Canewdon in the winter of 1959/60. He described Mrs. Garner, who was born in 1890, as the last of Canewdon's 'white witches'. She told Mike Howard in 1977 that her mother had informed her that George Pickingill was the leader of the Canewdon witches, and that he had 'many visitors' who came seeking his knowledge of occult arts. (Bill Liddell, 1999)".

As mentioned above, a picture of Lilian Garner appeared in the magazine, Man Myth and Magic. In an article, "Canewdon" on page 401 of volume 3 of the hardcover illustrated encyclopedia edition of "Man Myth and Magic".

She was not mentioned by name. However, it was in the article "Canewdon" that was written by Eric Maple.

There is no cemetery stone for her.

The burial records for Canewdon for 1982 is not available online.

From the emails from Paul Cooper, a great-grandson of Lilian Garner, dated Friday, December 4, 2009 and ----:

- "..... I have many wonderful memories of my gran garner and though it was common knowledge in my family that she was a white witch, I was too young to question her about it..."
- "..... Yes in 2009. Visited Canewdon again because of your website for the first time since gran garners funeral when I was 16... brought back great memorys of a wonderful lady and her spooky house".

From the newspaper, Grays & Tilbury Gazette, Saturday 24 October 1903:

CANEWDON.

Harvest Festival at the Parish Church

--- The Thanksgiving Services were held here on Sunday and were heartily rendered, especially in the evening, when the spacious old Church was well filled. The musical part of the service showed great and continued improvement in the Village Choir of men and boys under the tuition of Mrs. Hardy and they were fortunate in having Mr. Brook. the organist of Ashingdon Church, at the organ. As usual, the decoration were noted for chasteness and good taste rather than profusion, for which much credit is due to Mrs. Hardy, Mrs. F. Hallett, Mrs. Higby and the Misses Hallett Guiver and Pickworth. In the evening, the Vicar gave from Ruth ii., 4, an eloquent impassioned address. He spoke of Boaz as a successful man and the type of a good farmer who lived some 1,300 years before Christ. He contrasted his salutation to his men on entering the harvest field "The Lord be with you" and the reply of his men to him "The Lord bless thee" with much of the language used in our villages to-day. He showed how the promise of God that "Seedtime and harvest should never cease" was literally fulfilled year by year, for the sound of the reaper (or reaping machine) was in some part of the world being heard every day all the year round and if in one part of the world the crops might not be plentiful, yet there was always an abundance to be obtained. Pointing out how everything in the world. everything they used and could see in their daily life came out of the land directly or indirectly he showed how much they all had to be thankful for in addition to the harvest of corn. Referring to the lax way in which God's Day was kept, he said they could not expect His blessing on the labour if they neglected to honour His Sabbath, for as God said "Those who honour me I will honour". The offertories (36s.) were devoted equally to the Royal Agricultural Society and the Victoria Hospital.

The inner ceiling to the roof of the nave has been removed revealing a mass of beautiful timber, bearing indisputable signs of being as old as the tower itself. i.e., dating from 1464. The removal of this ceiling brought to light several defects in the roof. All the tiles were removed, and the roof has been put into a thoroughly safe and water tight condition. All this has been efficiently done by Messrs. Kemp and Allen, of Rochford, under the watchful eye of the Vicar (Rev. C. R. W. Hardy). For the festival, the sacred edifice had been beautifully decorated by Mrs. Hardy, who undertook the altar and communion rails; Mrs. Reeve, the choir stalls; the Misses Guiver, the pulpit; Mrs. Higby and Miss Lillian Higby, the font, lectern, pillars and window recesses. There were large congregations. The Vicar prefaced his sermon in the morning by alluding to the lateness of the festival, owing to the work of restoration. But it gave them the opportunity of meeting on what they might say was the birthday of the parish of Canewdon. On that day 892 years ago, between the spot where they were worshipping, and a radius of two or three miles, was fought what was known as the battle of Ashingdon, in which the able, but heathen Canute defeated Edmund Ironsides and became King of England. From this monarch the parish took its name.

"A story of Reverend Hardy's time is that of Jack Taylor who was courting one of the maids at the Vicarage. Every evening the Vicar went out with his dog, always at the same time, and Jack would wait and go in for a bite of supper with the girls.

One night the Vicar came back early and the maids sent Jack upstairs so that he would not be caught.

Jack decided to jump out of a bedroom window, but while deciding where best to jump, he spotted someone hiding and listening in the bushes. First he threw a ewerful of cold water down and the listener ran off soaking wet, then he jumped down and got away.

It was thought that the listener was Mrs. Higby of Vicarage Cottage who had found out about the suppers and was hoping to hear some fun when Jack was caught Jack Taylor later became Churchwarden for many years and is still well thought of."
